- The Swedish parliament approved a new aid package to Ukraine worth 270 million euros. It includes ammunition and spare parts, trucks, and demining equipment.
  - The UK Ministry of Defense has signed three contracts on behalf of the International Fund for Ukraine (IFU) to supply the Ukrainian Armed Forces with air defense equipment worth more than 90 million pounds (105 million euros).
  - Romania plans to double the transit of Ukrainian grain: "We hope that more than 60% of Ukraine's total grain exports will go through Romania," Romanian Prime Minister Marcel Ciolacu said. In the first seven months of 2023, Ukraine shipped 8.1 million tons of grain through the Romanian Black Sea port of Constanta, and 8.6 million tons for the entire 2022.
  - On Saturday, the President of Ukraine and his wife arrived on a visit to Sweden to hold negotiations with the country's top leadership on assistance to the Armed Forces, defense cooperation and European integration of Ukraine. During the visit, Zelenskyi and Swedish Prime Minister Ulf Kristersson signed a statement of intent regarding the production and maintenance of CV90 combat vehicles in Ukraine. In addition, Ukrainian pilots have already started introductory training on Swedish JAS 39 Gripen fighters.
  - President Zelenskyi, along with the First Lady and his team, arrived in the Netherlands for talks with Prime Minister Mark Rutte. After the meeting, it was announced that the Netherlands would hand over F-16 fighter jets.
  - The Danish Defense Minister announced that Denmark, together with the Netherlands, will provide Ukraine with F-16 fighter jets to help protect Ukrainian airspace. Danish Prime Minister Mette Frederiksen clarified that the first F-16s are planned to be sent to Ukraine before the New Year and added that the first batch will include about 6 aircraft. Next year, 8 more fighters will be sent to Ukraine, and 5 more in a year. She added that more than 70 pilots from Ukraine are now in Denmark and are preparing to start training.
  - President Zelenskyi has arrived on an official visit to Greece, where he will take part in the Ukraine-Balkans summit. At the meeting, leaders will discuss European and Euro-Atlantic integration, defense cooperation, and security.
  - Following the negotiations with Greek Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis, it was announced that Greece would join the so-called aviation coalition to train Ukrainians on F-16s. A joint declaration of support for Ukraine's membership in NATO was also signed. Athens declares that it will continue to provide military, technical, defense, and humanitarian support to Ukraine, as well as contribute to Ukraine's post-war reconstruction.
  - In Athens, Zelenskyi met with European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen. They discussed Kyiv's progress toward EU membership and alternative routes for the "grain corridor" after Russia's withdrawal from the Black Sea Grain Initiative, the Office of the President of Ukraine reports. Von der Leyen emphasized that Brussels and Kyiv will continue to work to ensure that Ukrainian grain reaches international markets.
    - In Athens, Zelenskyi also met with Serbian President Aleksandar Vucic. "An open, honest, productive conversation with the President of Serbia. We talked about respect for the UN Charter and the inviolability of borders, the future of our people in a common European home, and the development of relations that are in our common interest," the Ukrainian president wrote.

- ➢ European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen states that Ukraine has received another tranche of macro-financial assistance from the European Union in the amount of EUR 1.5 billion. According to her, the total amount of EU macro-financial assistance, disbursed to Ukraine since May 2022, has reached €19.2 billion.
- The Ukrainian government has admitted that it will not be able to garner support for its proposed format of a special tribunal against Russia's top military and political leadership based on a UN General Assembly resolution, and has instead agreed to a slightly modified format. Kyiv does not rule out the possibility of creating a so-called internationalized tribunal, which the United States, in particular, insists on. According to the Yevropeiska Pravda publication, the special tribunal will be set up in the Hague and will operate under Dutch law. The Dutch government has already given its preliminary consent.
- On August 23, Kyiv hosted the third summit of the Crimean Platform. Among the top guests who have come to Ukraine are Lithuanian President Gitanas Nausėda, Portuguese President Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa, Finnish Prime Minister Petteri Orpo, and Hungarian President Katalin Novak. This year, 63 states and organizations are participating in the summit. Among the new participants are Bahrain, Serbia, East Timor, the United Arab Emirates, the Danube Commission, UNESCO, and the World Tourism Organization. "Our common goal remains unchanged to create conditions for the liberation of the Crimea from occupation, as well as all the temporarily occupied territories of Ukraine," Ukrainian Foreign Minister Kuleba said at the opening of the summit.
- In the speech at the Crimean Platform summit, Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni assured Ukraine of support and called the West's response to Russia's 2014 aggression erroneous and insufficient. Meloni noted that Russia's annexation of Crimea in 2014 was a clear violation of international law and an attempt to realize Russia's aggressive intentions towards the whole of Ukraine. Meloni stated that Italy is also ready to assist in the reconstruction of Ukraine and will host the Ukraine Recovery Conference in 2025. French President Emmanuel Macron and German Foreign Minister Annalena Burbock emphasized that their countries did not recognize Russia's annexation of the occupied territories of Ukraine.
- Norway decides to provide Ukraine with F-16 fighter jets TV2. During his visit to Kyiv, Norwegian Prime Minister Jonas Gahr Støre also announced that Ukraine would receive air defense missiles and demining equipment.
- On the occasion of Ukraine's Independence Day, the Lithuanian Ministry of Defense announced that it would send another batch of military aid worth 41 million euros the new package includes Carl Gustaf ammunition, rifles, maritime surveillance radar systems, and anti-drone systems.
- At a press conference with Zelenskyi, Prime Minister Petteri Orpo said that Finland agreed on an 18th aid package for Ukraine worth €94 million. "There are things that are really needed: heavy weapons and ammunition," Orpo commented on the contents of the aid package.
- Orban's chief of staff says that Hungary wants the EU's ban on domestic sales of Ukrainian grain (expiring on September 15) to be extended in the five EU member states bordering Ukraine. He added that Budapest is ready to re-impose a national ban on imports if the EU does not extend the measure.
- Germany has transferred missiles for the Patriot air defense system to Ukraine for the first time. In addition to missiles, over the past week, Ukraine has received eight drone detection systems, 40 RQ-35 HEIDRUN reconnaissance drones, 16 Zetros trucks, and 510,000 rounds of ammunition for firearms.
- In a week, Slovenia, Kosovo, Luxembourg, and Montenegro joined the G7 declaration on long-term security assistance to Ukraine.

- > Towards the Volyn and Polissia, the operational situation has not changed significantly.
- > Towards the Chernihiv and Kharkiv, the enemy launched mortar and artillery attacks on populated areas.
- Towards Kupiansk, civil settlements were subjected to artillery and mortar shelling by Russian troops. Towards Lyman, the occupiers conducted unsuccessful offensives in the Novoiehorivka area of the Luhansk Oblast. Russian troops carried out airstrikes and artillery fire.
- > Towards Bakhmut, Russian forces conducted unsuccessful offensive actions in the Orikhovo-Vasylivka and Klishchiivka districts of the Donetsk Oblast. Airstrikes and artillery fire were carried out.
- Towards Avdiivka, the enemy carried out unsuccessful offensive actions in the area of Stepove, Donetsk Oblast. Settlements of the Donetsk Oblast were subjected to artillery shelling. Towards Mariinka, the defense forces continue to hold back the advance of Russian troops in the Mariinka area. Towards Shakhtarsk, the enemy carried out airstrikes in the areas of Vuhledar, Staromaiorske, Donetsk region.
- > Towards Zaporizhzhia, the enemy carried out airstrikes in the districts of Mala Tokmachka, Orikhiv, and Robotyne of the Zaporizhzhia Oblast.
- > At the same time, the Defense Forces of Ukraine continue to conduct an offensive operation in the Melitopol direction, are entrenched at the achieved boundaries, and carry out counter-battery countermeasures.
- The armed forces continue to destroy the enemy in the Kherson direction. Russian bloggers spread information about the undersupply of their army, as well as oppression by Ukrainian units. They are very annoyed by the counter-battery fight, a powerful strike is taking place from those positions that the Russians tried to master after the outflow of water provoked by the man-made disaster at the Kakhovka HPP.

- 21.08 Three more branches of the pipeline are under construction to supply water to the communities of Kryvyi Rih district. umanitarian > The Russian occupation administration is preparing a **new wave of mobilization in Crimea**. This was reported by the Crimean partisan movement "Atesh". It is specified that the occupiers plan to mobilize up to 30 thousand people. The Russians also plan to draft up to 10 thousand conscripts. > Ukraine will set up mixed medical commissions for the exchange of prisoners of war. According to the Geneva Conventions, three doctors are involved in such a commission: one 24.08 from the country that holds prisoners of war, and two from neutral countries. This was reported by the Defense Intelligence of Ukraine. Due to mixed medical commissions, 22.08 Ukrainian prisoners of war will be able to receive the necessary medicines and medical care or be repatriated to neutral countries. > The press service of the Ministry of Environmental Protection and Natural Resources of Ukraine reported that the bottom of the former Kakhovka reservoir, left without water, was sown with various herbs. Environmentalists from the Kamianska Sich National Nature Park stored the plants to prevent dust storms and the spread of alien species. 25.08 > The Mariupol City Council has published lists of children killed by the occupiers in 23.08 Donetsk oblast in 2022, including during the siege of Mariupol. According to the Russian list, 101 Mariupol children died during the bombing. Among them, 87 could be identified. ransatlantic Dialogue Center www.tdcenter.org
- > The occupiers are now bringing garbage from Rostov Oblast, the Russian Federation, to the temporarily occupied territory of Donetsk Oblast. Transporting garbage from Rostov to landfills in Donetsk oblast, the occupiers are solving the problem of overloaded landfills in the Russian Federation. According to the National Resistance Center, the invaders promised to build two more landfills in Donetsk oblast. They will also serve the neighboring Rostov oblast. At the same time, the Russians refused to build new landfills in Rostov oblast because of its environmental condition.
- > Oleksandr Kubrakov, Minister for Communities, Territories and Infrastructure Development reports that Russia has destroyed 13,000 tons of grain as a result of a drone attack on the port of Izmail. He noted that Russia is systematically hitting grain tanks and warehouses to stop agricultural exports. Last night alone, the export capacity of the port of Izmail was reduced by 15%. Before that, it was the port of Reni and 35 thousand tons of grain were destroyed there.

- > On August 24, starting at 4 a.m., Russian security forces broke into the homes of Crimean Tatars in Bakhchisarai and Bakhchisarai district with searches in the temporarily occupied Crimea. This was reported in Telegram by the head of the Mejlis of the Crimean Tatar people Refat Chubarov. "It is known that searches are now taking place in Ruslan Asanov, Seydamet Mustafaiev, Remzi Nemetulaiev, Abdulmejit Seytumerov, Ametkhan Umerov and Eldar Yakubov's houses," he wrote. The Head of the Mejlis considers this to be the occupiers' revenge for the third summit of the Crimean Platform and his own fear of the inevitable liberation of Crimea.
- > Another 11 Ukrainian children are returned from Russia and the temporarily occupied territories. This was reported by former Presidential Commissioner for Children's Rights Mykola Kuleba. "As of today, there are already 161 children who have been returned by the Save Ukraine team," Kuleba wrote. As of the morning of August 14, the Russian army has killed 502 children in Ukraine. In addition, at least 1599 children have suffered from Russian aggression.

- > The war unleashed by Russia has led to the **deaths of about 1,000 dolphins** in the Black Sea, both on the Ukrainian coast and in Turkey and Bulgaria. The destruction of the Kakhovka hydroelectric power plant by Russian occupiers was one of the biggest blows to the Ukrainian environment. As a result of the dam being blown up, about 15 billion cubic meters of fresh water flowed into the Black Sea and the Dnipro delta, disrupting their ecosystems and leading to significant desalination of the sea.
- > A new pipeline between the Inhulets River and the Southern Reservoir has been put into operation in Dnipropetrovsk oblast. The pipeline solves the problem of water supply for the residents of Kryvyi Rih due to the Russian terrorist attack on the Kakhovka HPP. It was built at the expense of the Fund for the Liquidation of the Consequences of Russian Aggression.
